

Group Biography

The house darkens as stage lights focus upon two young men and a lady. Flute to lips and bows to violin & cello, the first note heralds a journey across borders, worlds and time steeped in legends and magic. "I've never heard anything like this," audiences exclaim; *Sonic Escape* responds by playing harder, composing better, digging deeper.

As graduates of The Juilliard School, Shawn Wyckoff (flute), Maria Kaneko Millar (violin) and Michael Haas (cello) have performed in classical music's greatest halls – The Kennedy Center, Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center, to name a few. They've also traveled the world in roles as diverse as fiddle-dancing in *Riverdance*, jamming with Beale Street blues bands, soloing & drumming with taiko troupes, improvising with Native-American flute masters, dancing while performing the tango music of Astor Piazzolla, and playing rock clubs across NYC. This lifelong commitment to devouring new sounds and pushing boundaries – both within themselves and the musical establishment – is why *Sonic Escape* (formerly *Silver Roots*) came to be. It's also how the trio amassed a ridiculous technique that makes audiences swear they're hearing an orchestra of a dozen different instruments or the synchronous voice of one.

Ultimately, the total *Sonic Escape* experience is what makes lifelong believers out of initiates. Humor and candid conversation draw audiences into the music, while the players' backgrounds in acting, singing and dancing turn concerts into unforgettable performance events. Improvisation takes it up a notch, infusing shows with pure, dynamic energy. As music and stories intertwine, audiences are taken on a rollercoaster ride of emotions, revelations, and ultimately, the desire to learn more. Interaction and innovation are the hallmarks of *Sonic Escape*.

Individual Biographies

Violinist and composer Maria Kaneko Millar has performed as a soloist throughout Canada, Ireland, China, Japan and the US; The Canadian, British and American Broadcasting Corporations as well as The WB's One World Jam, CBS Sunday Morning and CBS The Early Show have aired her work. 170 performances as Solo Dancing Fiddler in Riverdance On Broadway and the North American and Asian Tours of Riverdance: The Show featured improvised solos and simultaneous dance. Maria also performed in Radio City Music Hall's One World Jam and premiered her creation for 5 prerecorded violin tracks and 1 live dancing violinist, All for One, on CBC's nationally televised The Great Canadian Music Dream. Maria has toured North America with her one-woman show of original works for violin, voice and dance, playing venues such as The Kennedy Center and The Library & Archives of Canada. Canada Council for the Arts, Alberta Foundation for the Arts and the Lower Manhattan Cultural Council have awarded Maria with composition and space grants; Samson sponsors Maria, providing audio, wireless and effects processing equipment specific to her roles as singer, acoustic/electric violinist and dancer. Maria lives to improvise: her arrangements and aural transcriptions of Asian, Celtic, Gypsy, Klezmer, Tango, Turkish, blues, jazz, pop, rock and classical music have laid the foundation for fearless ad-libbing in any setting. Maria holds accelerated BM/MM's in Violin Performance from The Juilliard School.

Flutist Shawn Wyckoff is an avid solo and chamber musician who has been featured in performances at Carnegie Hall, Avery Fisher Hall, The Kennedy Center, Weill Recital Hall, Merkin Concert Hall, The Library of Congress, BargeMusic, MOMA and the Guggenheim Museum. Shawn is the artistic director, flutist and music arranger for *TetraWind*, a woodwind quartet specializing in contemporary American music. Shawn's orchestral work includes concerts with *Continuum*, One World Symphony and The Harmonia Opera Company. Shawn is a First Prize winner of The Judith Lapple National Flute Competition, the Flute Society of Washington Competition and The Friday Morning Music Club Woodwind Competition. He was named a Maryland Distinguished Scholar of the Arts and received the Stephen Brewster Award (as chosen by a panel of National Symphony Orchestra musicians), the John Philip Sousa Award and the National Alliance for Excellence Award. Shawn holds a BM in Flute Performance from The Juilliard School.

Cellist **Michael Haas** is an experienced performer of chamber and orchestral music, frequently appearing in New York City and across the country. He is the cellist of the *Momenta Quartet*, a group that champions works by living composers and holds residencies at Temple, Yeshiva and Cornell Universities. Most recently, Michael performed at the Society for Ethical Culture, Alice Tully Hall and The Kennedy Center. He is a member of the New Haven Symphony Orchestra and has also performed with the New York Philharmonic, American Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra of St. Luke's and as Principal Cellist of the Haddonfield Symphony. Michael holds a BM from the Curtis Institute of Music and an MM from The Juilliard School.

Japan Meets World explores Japan's most beloved folk songs and anime soundtracks alongside compositions by Maria Kaneko Millar and contemporary classical works that infuse western forms with Japanese sounds and scales. Powerhouse virtuosity and soulful lyricism on the flute, violin and cello combine with song, dance and an extended technique that transforms western instruments into a traditional Japanese orchestra! Music from China, Ireland, Germany, Austria and Canada color the evening, highlighting the uniqueness of each while showcasing the universal bond shared by all.

Echoing Voices: A Musical History of America

Echoing Voices presents music from the homelands of immigrants through their stories and history of coming to America. Ancient Dances

Ancient Dances takes its cue from the dances and traditional music of Europe; up-tempo dance tunes from Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Germany, Ireland and England are presented with classic *Sonic Escape* flair. A narrative, theatrically woven throughout the program, tells the story of where the music traveled and how it came to be. Solo works by J.S. Bach introduce Irish traditional tunes of like rhythm and step. *Sonic Escape's* musical arrangements and eclectic tastes pave the way for a mind-bending, sonic adventure!

Workshops - Highlights

Since 2008, Sonic Escape's members have presented workshops, masterclasses and outreach programs for students and audiences of universities, schools (Grade 3-12), libraries and youth orchestras, including Lincoln Center, The Juilliard School, University of Alberta, University of Calgary and Irish Arts Center in NYC. Participants' ages have ranged from under 5 to over 65 with skill sets ranging from no musical experience to professional classical or folk musician. The following are synopses of select *Sonic Escape* workshops:

Introduction to Improvisation

Learn basic tools that allow you to instantly unleash your inner improviser! The workshop begins with exercises that sensitize and strengthen the students' ears (such as reproducing sounds and phrases by ear, group and individual call-and-response and musical telephone). Improvisation is then taught in two stages. Stage 1: students learn how to derive improvisational ideas from technique, personal experiences, senses, surroundings and movement. Stage 2: students learn to hone and thematically develop their improvisations by setting parameters (such as improvising within a set rhythm, key or tempo). Finally, students are divided into groups of 2 - 4 and exercises are assigned that utilize improvisation to create collaborative pieces.

How to Produce and Present Your Own Concert

Sonic Escape walks you through the steps involved in successfully producing your own concert, including seeking out a venue, creating a preparation timeline, structuring a program, speaking in front of an audience, and documenting/disseminating your work via audio and video recordings to review your performance and generate future opportunities. The definitive course on how to grow and sustain a rich career in music.

Technique for Strings and Woodwinds

Learn how to play your instrument better! With simple answers to even the most complex questions, Sonic Escape addresses all technical issues and obstacles that confront string and woodwind players.
